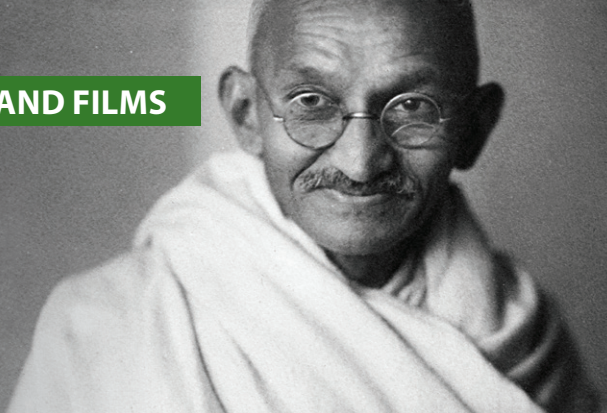

#### Marie Lannoo: the architecture of colour

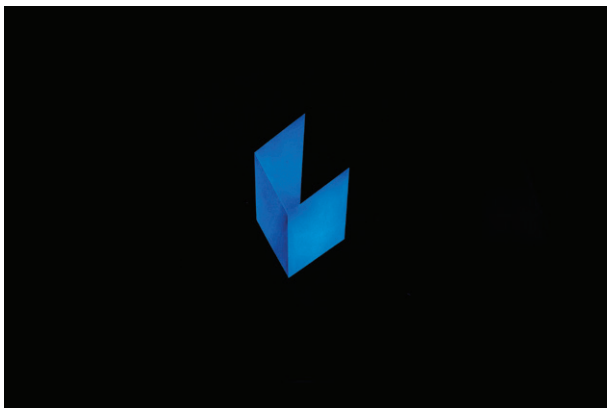
